

Past domination and abuse	Calls for reparation	A difficult balance to find
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Migrant workers post WWII = essential sectors for reconstruction + 1950s development (1+2) • Unfair treatment / injustice when these workers are no longer needed : 2012 immigration repression & absurd deportation of people born in the UK in Windrush families (1+2) • Violent repression of fight for independence in Kenya + inhumane massacres = cruelty & impunity of the Empire (2) • Colonial oppression + exploitation of colonial subjects to support British economy: followed by repression (1+2) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Growing criticism in the Commonwealth and specifically the Caribbeans after the treatment of the Windrush generation and their descendants (doc 1-2) • Kenyan demands for clear apologies (doc 2) • Institutional attempts to repair past violence: cf Windrush compensation scheme but not satisfactory (doc 1-2) • Insufficient / inefficient response from the former empire (doc 1) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scandals & protests = proof of mistreatment and neglect (Windrush population) + human rights violations (Kenya + wrongful deportation of Caribbean immigrants) (1) • Difficult communication to maintain Commonwealth unity & support for the UK: image of an oppressive empire (2) • Royal visits BUT insufficient apologies + government at center of criticism (1) • Recent scandals revive scars of colonial domination (1)
