## How to express a hypothesis Modal verbs

/hai'pαθəsis/

> In English you can use modal verbs to phrase hypotheses and you must choose it to reflect your degree of certainty.

**Might** > lower level of possibility, even <u>uncertainty</u> or <u>speculation</u>.

May > a possibility that is <u>likely</u>, though not guaranteed.

**Could** > slightly more likely, hypothetical or <u>potential</u>.

**Would** > depends on certain <u>conditions</u> being met. (*If cars drove themselves, then roads would be safer.*)

**Can** > an ability or potential <u>based on what is possible</u>.

## How to express a hypothesis Modal verbs

/hai'pαθəsis/

/!\ Never followed by a conjugated verb.

Ex: In the future, Al might become superintelligent.

It **could** have been imagined by a sci-fi writer.

Will can -> will be able to
