# 1. DEFINITION

- Trad-wife is a portmanteau of “traditional” + “wife”, describing an internet subculture of women who promote traditional gender roles (housewife, homemaker, mother) on social media platforms like TikTok and Instagram.
- These women often show aestheticized domestic content (cooking, cleaning, parenting) similar to a 1950s idea of family life.
- The term began gaining traction in the early 2020s and became viral through posts performing domestic labor.
- Key idea: It’s as much a social media phenomenon as it is a cultural one — reality and performance blur because many of these women monetize the lifestyle.

# 2.CONTEXT

- The U.S. total fertility rate fell to a historic low of ~1.6 children per woman in 2024 — below the replacement level (~2.1) needed for a stable population size.
- This long-term decline is part of a broader societal shift (delayed marriage, economic concerns, housing/childcare costs, etc.).
- Although there was a small 1% increase in total births in 2024, experts caution that it doesn't reverse the overall downward trend in fer

Why this matters: Lower fertility can affect economic growth, workforce size, and social systems like pension funding — concerns raised by researchers and policymakers.

# 3.HOW ARE TRAD-WIVES CONNECTED TO BITRHRATES

## a) Trend as idealization of traditional family life

- Trad-wives often promote homemaking and child-rearing as fulfilling choices, sometimes implicitly suggesting more children and family focus are desirable ways of living.

## b) Cultural reaction to modern pressures

- Many participants frame this lifestyle as a reaction against career stress or modern feminism, seeking comfort in an idealized version of family and stability.
- This cultural message touches on birth and family formation indirectly — it valorizes domestic life over career life

## c) Connection to pro-natalist messaging

Even if not universally political, this aesthetic can overlap with pronatalism — the belief that society should encourage more births:

- Politicians and social conservatives in the U.S. have expressed concern about declining birth rates and explored ways to promote child-bearing.
- Some families and advocates openly argue having more children is important for cultural or economic reasons.

Important nuance: Most researchers agree one social media trend won't shift national birth rates on its own — economic, social, and policy supports matter far more (e.g., childcare support, housing affordability).

# 4. CRITICISMS & CONTROVERSIES

Critics argue that trad-wives trend can romanticize outdated gender norms and ignore structural issues around work, equality, and choice.

Some see it as part of a culture war narrative rather than honest demographic solution.

Social media often aestheticizes and monetizes the lifestyle, which can be misleading and exclusive (not everyone can afford to stay home).
