Proposed Constitutional Amendments

Provides for suspension of compensation of certain State officers and members of the General Assembly

"Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to suspend the compensation of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State School Superintendent, Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of Agriculture, Commissioner of Labor, or any member of the General Assembly while such individual is suspended from office following indictment for a felony?"

<u>Provides for temporary local tax</u> relief after disasters

"Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to provide that the governing authority of each county, municipality, and consolidated government and the board of education of each independent and county school system in this state shall be authorized to grant temporary tax relief to properties within its jurisdiction which are severely damaged or destroyed as a result of a disaster and located with a nationally declared disaster area?"

Statewide Referendum

Provides for ad valorem tax exemption for certain timber production, reforestation and harvesting equipment

"Shall the Act be approved which grants a state-wide exemption from all ad valorem taxes for certain equipment used by timber producers in the production or harvest of timber?"

Expands ad valorem tax exemption for family-owned farms and adds qualified products to the exemption

"Shall the Act be approved which expands a state-wide exemption from ad valorem taxes for agricultural equipment and certain farm products held by certain entities to include entities comprising two or more family owned farm entities, and which adds dairy products and unfertilized eggs of poultry as qualified farm products with respect to such exemption?"

Special Election Douglas County

SPLOST

"Shall a special one percent sales and use tax be imposed in the special district of Douglas County for a period of time not to exceed twenty-four calendar quarters (6 years) and for the purpose of raising an estimated amount of \$160,000,000 for the following purposes, pursuant to an Intergovernmental Contract, dated as of September 15, 2022, among Douglas County, Georgia, the City of Austell, the City of Douglasville and the City of Villa Rica, which qualified municipalities comprise more than 50% of the municipal population of the special district (A)(1) funding the following capital outlay projects for Douglas County: (1) Transportation (including roadway improvements and maintenance, sidewalk improvements, rights of way acquisitions, and other projects): (2) Public Safety (including upgrades for major equipment, fleet replacements, major building and technology improvements and other projects); (3) Parks and Recreation/Libraries (including major equipment and facility improvements, library construction and enhancements, and other projects); and (4) Facilities/Infrastructure (including facilities acquisitions, construction or enhancements, infrastructure improvements, and other projects) (the "County Projects");)B) funding the following capital outlay projects for the City of Austell: (1) Improvements and Renovations to Louise Suggs Park and a new police vehicle; (C) funding the following capital outlay projects for the City of Douglasville: (1) Transportation and Streets (including roadway improvements and other projects), (2) Public Safety, (3) Parks and Recreation, and (4) Facility Infrastructure (the "Douglasville Projects"); and (D) funding the following capital outlay projects for the City of Villa Rica: (1) Transportation and Streets (including roadway improvements and other projects); (2) Infrastructure; and (3) Public Safety (including, but not limited to, fire and EMS)?

If the imposition of the tax is approved by the voters, such vote shall also constitute approval of the issuance of general obligation debt of Douglas County in the principal amount not to exceed \$110,000,000 for the County Projects listed as items (A)(1) through (4) above."
