Text 11: Migration has radicalised middle England

• Middle England fearing and protesting against new HMOs/hotels opening nearby to host legal immigrants.

• New migrants coming to receive freebies and ^{on} stealing all the available Hammed Quarters to military families and military families being "housed in budget hotels".

• Women and mothers turning out at the protests against sexual harassment.

• The government's decision to "shuttle migrants into provincial towns and hope no one will notice" thanks to the online safety jet and the national Security online Information Team.

Text 12: Should Britain deploy the navy to prevent small-boat crossings?

• 90% of the Conservative and 80% of the Labour think that military should be used in peacetime to enforce domestic laws such as border control.

• Similar efforts have failed in the past.

• International law obliges vessels to rescue people in distress; they cannot just be turned back.

Text 13: Scrap the asylum system - and build something better.

The principle of "non-refoulement" is not working anymore because of the conflict/predatorisation and the wage disparities.

Policy makers should separate labour migration from asylum seekers. Asylum seekers should be able to go to closer countries so they are culturally closer & more likely to go home (as a "third country").
