## FORME NÉGATIVE

**Présent simple**

I **work** every day.  
He **works** every day.

**DO**

I **don't work** every day.  
He **doesn't work** every day.

**Présent en BE + -ING**

Look! I **am** / I'**m working**.  
You **are** / You'**re working**.  
She **is** / She'**s working**.

**BE**

I'**m not working**.  
You'**re not working**.  
She **isn't working**.

**Prétérît simple**

I **had** a bath yesterday.  
I **bought** a tablet yesterday.

**DID**

I **didn't have** a bath yesterday.  
I **didn't buy** a tablet yesterday.

**Prétérît en BE + -ING**

I **was watching** TV when the phone rang.  
We **were watching** TV when the phone rang.

**BE**

I **wasn't watching** TV.  
We **weren't** /'wɜ:nt/ **watching** TV.

**Present perfect simple**

I **have been** to England several times.  
She **has been** to England several times.

**HAVE**

I **haven't done** the washing up yet.  
He **hasn't done** the washing up yet.

**Present perfect en BE + -ING**

I'm tired. I'**ve** / I **have been working** all day.  
She is tired. She'**s** / **has been working** all day.

**HAVE BEEN**

I **haven't been working** all day.  
She **hasn't been working** all day.

**Past perfect**

When the mother arrived, the children **had** already **done** their homework.

**HAD**

They **hadn't done** their homework.

**Futur**

We **will** / I'**ll go** to the cinema next week.

**WILL**

We **won't go** to the cinema.

**Conditionnel**

I **would** / I'**d go** now, if I could.

**Would** you go if you could?

No, I **wouldn't**.
