The IPCC was created by the U.N. in 1988.

The 1997 Kyoto Protocol aimed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by developed countries.

The 2015 U.N. Climate Change Conference, also known as COP 21, resulted in **the Paris Agreement**, which aims to keep average temperatures within 1.5 °C above pre-industrial levels.

In 2018, fifteen-year-old Swedish activist **Greta Thunberg** addressed COP 24. She initiated an international weekly protest by students against governments' failure to comply with their COP 21 commitments (**Fridays for Future**).

In 2023, chemical companies, including 3M and Dupont, agreed to pay billions of dollars to settle lawsuits in which they were accused of contaminating water with **PFAS** in the US.
