## LE MARIAGE HOMOSEXUEL

a more gay-friendly society?

There is growing support in the general population for the recognition of same-sex marriage throughout the developed world and in some developing countries. Civil partnerships were first recognized by Denmark in 1989 and same-sex marriage was first legalized in the Netherlands in 2001. It is now legal in 29 countries all over the world from Canada (2003), South Africa (2006), New Zealand and France (2013), England and Wales (2014), Ireland (2015), Australia (2017). It has been legal in the US since 2015, when the Supreme Court ruled that state-level bans on same-sex marriage are unconstitutional. A 2015 US study has shown that the legalization of gay marriage is associated with a significant drop in suicide rates among children.

The Stonewall riots were a series of violent demonstrations against a police raid that took place on June 28, 1969, at the Stonewall Inn, a gay bar in the Greenwich Village neighborhood of New York City. They are considered as the start of the gay rights movement in the United States. "Stonewall" is also the name of a gay rights organization in Great Britain.

**LGBT** [eldʒbi:ti:] (or GLBT) is an abbreviation referring to lesbian, **g**ay, **b**isexual, and transgender people. In use since the 1990s, the term LGBT has replaced the adjective "gay" which was felt to be too restrictive. Some have criticized it as being too politically (or non-heterosexual) people.

SAME-SEX MARRIAGE

In a historic decision, India's Supreme Court has ruled that gay sex is no longer a criminal offence. The ruling overturns (annuler) a 2013 judgement that upheld a colonial era law, known as section 377, under which gay sex is categorised as an "unnatural offence". The court has now ruled discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation is a fundamental violation of rights. Campaigners outside the court cheered and some broke down in tears as the ruling was handed down. Although public opinion in India's biggest cities has been in favour of scrapping (supprimer) the law, there remains strong opposition among religious groups and in conservative rural communities. But this ruling, from the top court, is the final say in the matter and represents a huge victory for India's LGBT community.

The Imitation Game is a 2013 film starring Benedict Cumberbatch as Alan Turing, a brilliant mathematician and founder of modern computer science. Turing played a key role in decrypting German intelligence messages during World War II and thus made a major contribution to the Allied victory over Nazism. But a few years after the war, Turing was prosecuted (poursuivi) for homosexual acts and convicted of "indecency". Rather than go to prison, he chose to undergo chemical castration, which had devastating physical and psychological effects. Two years later, he committed suicide. Homosexuality was decriminalized in 1967 in Britain, but it was only in 2009 that the British government issued an apology for "the appalling (effroyable) way he was treated" in the words of Prime Minister Gordon Brown.

Adam and Steve is a phrase that originated from a conservative Christian slogan "God made Adam and Eve, not Adam and Steve", which implies that the natural way of life for humanity is illustrated by the Biblical account (récit) of the creation of human beings as a male-female pair. The phrase appeared on a protest sign as early as 1970. Opponents of gay marriage are sometimes referred to as the "God-didn't-create-the-Adam-and-Steve lobby".

A study published in 2016 using data from the US National Survey of Children's Health for 2011-2012 compared outcomes for children aged six to 17 years in 95 female same sex parented families and 95 opposite-sex parented families. It found no differences in outcomes for children raised by lesbian parents compared to heterosexual parents on a range of outcomes including general health, emotional difficulties, coping behaviour and learning behaviour. A paper published for the American Sociological Association in 2014 reviewed 10 years' of scientific literature (études scientifiques) on child well-being in same sex parented families in the US. The authors concluded there was a clear consensus that children raised by same-sex couples fared (s'en sortaient) as well as children raised by opposite-sex couples.
