### 3) Summarising the text

This article from *The Guardian* shows a **dysfunctional** healthcare system in the US through the perspective of several personal experiences. The system is presented as **flawed**: people are **denied** healthcare, have to wait several months to receive **approval**, or are forced to pay very expensive **out-of-pocket costs**. Many Americans have noticed that the situation is becoming worse and worse. For them, this is due to a **for-profit system** that prioritises profit over health. Indeed, insurance companies are **run by** private corporations that seem **driven solely** by profit. As a result, many Americans feel **exhausted** or avoid healthcare altogether. Very few of them - the rich and healthy - admit that they benefit from such a system compared to healthcare systems in other countries, which operate on the basis of **mandatory** contributions and redistribution.
